

Judo Young Officials Award Costs & Criteria



The Judo Young Official Award (YOA) is aimed at young people aged 14-19. The course is a combination of practical and theoretical sessions designed to provide the Young Official with the necessary skills and a qualification that will allow them to table official at Judo events.

Following the completion of this Award the Young Official will be directed towards judo competition, starting with low level events, and leading onto some being selected to officiate at high profile events such as the UK School Games.

Course Content: What is Judo, the role of the Official, terminology, time keeping, scoring, referee signals, health & safety, and what to do next?

The YOA is delivered by trained affiliated Tutors. Delivery is supported by an electronic presentation and DVD. Each candidate will receive a resource pack including Young Official cue cards.

Area required	Recommendation: Theoretical and practical session to be delivered in the sports hall with mats. If Projector facilities are not available in the Sports Hall, a Lecture room is suitable for the theoretical session.
