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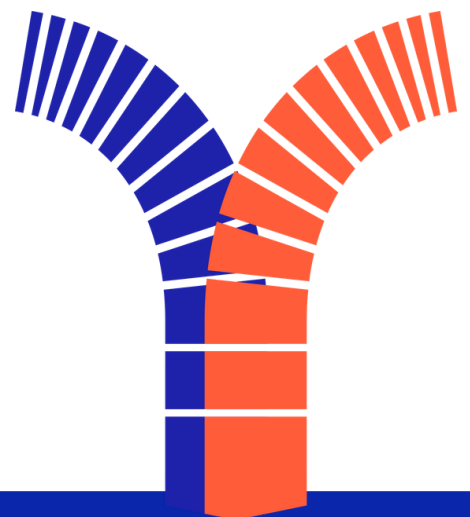


Active Uniform: Top tips & reflective questions



Move Well.

Introducing an active uniform is a simple but powerful way to help pupils move more throughout the school day. Schools that have successfully made the change often report benefits for participation, wellbeing, confidence and learning.

01 Start with your 'Why'

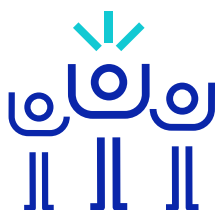


Be clear about why you're making the change. An active uniform should support:

- More opportunities for movement throughout the day.
- Inclusion for all pupils.
- Improved health and wellbeing.
- Better readiness for learning.

Having a shared purpose helps bring your whole school community with you.

02 Engage your stakeholders



Talk to:

- Governors
- Staff
- Parents and carers
- Pupils

Share the benefits, answer questions openly and involve people in the journey.

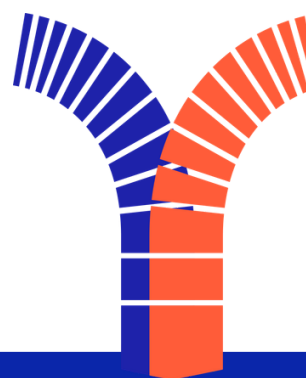
03 Keep it simple



An active uniform doesn't need to be complicated.

Aim for clothing that allows children to comfortably:

- Run
- Jump
- Climb
- Play
- Learn actively



04 Think about affordability



Ensure any changes are:

- Cost-effective for families.
- Easy to purchase.
- Compatible with existing uniform wherever possible.

Minimise unnecessary expense and branded items.

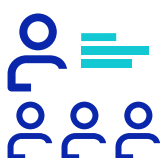
05 Review your school day



An active uniform works best when it supports:

- Active lessons
- Outdoor learning
- Active breaktimes
- Physical Education
- School sport
- Everyday movement

Consider how the uniform complements your wider approach to physical activity.



06 Support staff to embrace the change

Staff confidence is key.

Help colleagues understand how an active uniform can encourage:

- More active teaching approaches.
 - Increased pupil participation.
 - Greater flexibility throughout the school day.

07 Communicate clearly with families



Explain:

- Why you're making the change.
- What the new expectations are.
- When the change will take place.
- How it benefits children's learning and wellbeing.

Clear communication helps build support and reduces uncertainty.

08 Celebrate success!



Share examples of how the active uniform is making a difference.

Celebrate:

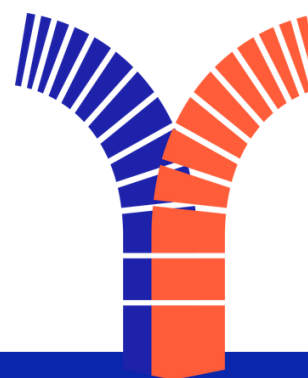
- Increased participation.
- Positive pupil feedback.
- Staff experiences.
- Success stories from across the school.

These stories help maintain momentum and inspire others.

Reflection Questions for Leadership Teams

- How active is a typical day for our pupils?
- Does our current uniform help or hinder our pupils?
- Where are the opportunities to introduce more movement into learning?
- Which groups of pupils would benefit most from increased activity?
- What would an "active school" look and feel like in our context?

These questions can provide a useful starting point for strategic discussions.

Questions to ask potential suppliers

Before choosing a supplier, consider asking:

Can you provide an active uniform rather than a traditional PE kit?

Do you offer affordable, unbranded options alongside branded garments?

Can parents order directly online?

What are your lead times for new schools?

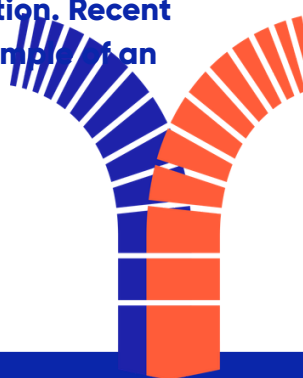
Do you offer sustainable or recycled fabric options?

Can you support phased implementation if we are transitioning from a traditional uniform?

What support do you provide with sizing, samples and parent communications?

Learn from schools already making the change

Many schools across England have successfully introduced active uniforms, reporting increased opportunities for movement, improved inclusion and positive feedback from pupils, staff and families. The Active Uniform Alliance, supported by the Youth Sport Trust, shares case studies, practical guidance and examples from schools that have already made the transition.
