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What are the benefits of playing my sport?

In2Hockey is a fun, engaging and dynamic game designed for 10–14 year olds. It can be played as either a seven-a-side game with goalkeepers or a six-a-side game without goalkeepers. The small sided nature of the game means players get more touches of the ball, increased levels of physical activity and the opportunity to develop their skills.

Simple rules:

- Two sets of rules are available, one for 7-a-side and one for 6-a-side.
- Each team comprises of a maximum of 10 players. If playing 7-a-side only seven players from each team can participate at one time; six outfield and one goalkeeper. If playing six-a-side only six players can play on the pitch at one time.
- In2Hockey allows and encourages rolling substitutions.

Think inclusively!

In2Hockey is specifically designed to suit a range of abilities with the game being played as either 6 or 7-a-side.

Additional adaptations to the game could include:

- Partnering players up so they are only able to tackle a specific player.
- Providing a player with a few seconds to control the ball before they are able to tackle.
- Apply interception only rules.
- Enable one player per team who cannot be tackled.
- Increase or decrease the size of the pitch. Increasing the pitch will provide players more time with the ball.
