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Introduction

The Youth Sport Trust ("YST") whose principal offices are in SportPark, Loughborough University, 3 Oakwood Drive, Loughborough, Leicestershire LE11 3QF, invites a research organisation to evaluate the Inclusion 2028 project.

It is YST's intention to let a contract for 3 years, with year 2 and year 3 subject to continuation of government funding, reviewed annually.

This document sets out the requirements for the research project.

About the Youth Sport Trust

YST is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated and registered as a charity in 2001. It succeeded an unincorporated charitable trust established in 1994 by Sir John Beckwith CBE and Duncan Goodhew MBE.

Our **vision** is a future where every child enjoys the life-changing benefits of play and sport.

Our *mission* is to equip educators and empower young people to build bright futures.

Together, we create opportunities for everyone to belong and achieve.

Our 2022-35 strategy has three objectives:

- <u>Urgent action</u>: Build back healthier, happier and more resilient young people, and level the playing field for those most disadvantaged.
- <u>Generational shift</u>: To balance the demands of the digital age through the human connection of physical play and sport.
- <u>Societal change</u>: Transform society's perceptions and attitudes towards the importance of physical literacy, play & sport in the education & development of young people.

Starting locally and building momentum, we will galvanise and **inspire changemakers** to transform attitudes, improve practice and drive policy change. Together we will harness the power of play and sport to **build belonging** for a generation, improving their health, fostering inclusion, and developing character and leadership.

To deliver our strategy we have identified six key groups of **changemakers** and how they are best placed to **build belonging**. These groups form the basis for our six strategy tactics which are to:

- **Equip educators** to rebuild wellbeing and level up life chances of young people most affected by Covid-19, and those suffering from the effect of inequalities.
- **Empower young people** by unleashing a nationwide community of young leaders, who harness the positive power of play and sport to improve wellbeing, build friendships, and foster understanding.
- **Unite a movement** of organisations to reclaim play and sport at the heart of every school and make it fun for everyone.
- **Mobilise influencers** in all areas of public life to make the decline of physical activity levels and human connection in a digital age, matters of national concern.

- **Help families** understand and champion their children's physical literacy and its importance to a healthy and happy childhood.
- Change from within by increasing our impact on, connection with, and relevance to, a changing world.

About the Project

This is an exciting opportunity for an experienced research organisation to work with the YST and our partners to deliver a robust evaluation of Inclusion 2028. Inclusion 2028 is a new project that builds on the work of Inclusion 2024 aiming to enable **all** young people with special educational needs and disabilities to have **choices** and **chances** in PE, school sport and physical activity. By working with a consortium of partners, (Activity Alliance, nasen, Paralympics GB and Swim England), the project aims to upskill educational practitioners' knowledge and confidence to deliver inspiring, accessible and meaningful opportunities for all.

The YST Lead Inclusion School Network

A network of 50 YST Lead Inclusion Schools from across England have been established, each selected for their recognised expertise in engaging young people with Special Educational Needs/Disability (SEND) to participate, compete and lead through PE and School Sport. They are Inclusion Champions and are visionaries for what high quality, meaningful and inclusive PE and School Sport should look like for every child. There is at least one Lead Inclusion school in each English county.

Our vision is to ensure that every young person is provided with a sporting chance to succeed in life through increased equality of opportunity. We aspire to empower and enable others to see the importance of Inclusive high-quality PE, physical activity and school sport provision for all young people. Ensuring that it is:

- Inspiring: something that they want to take part in.
- Accessible: something that they can take part in.
- Meaningful: something that they can actually benefit from.

For the Department for Education funded Inclusion 2028 programme, the YST will work collaboratively with pupils, schools, expert practitioners and local/national partners to drive quality and accessibility of opportunities for SEND pupils to participate, engage and learn through PE, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA). Building on the innovation of Inclusion 2024, this programme will aim to provide choice and chances for every child in PESSPA.

Project aim

- 1. **Build 'increased':** Access to opportunities to participate and empowerment of pupils with SEND.
- 2. **Build 'further':** The capacity, capability & effective practice of the workforce generating sector-led improvement.
- 3. **Build 'with':** partners to innovate, encourage cross-sector collaboration and strengthen our collective ambition.
- 4. **Build 'in':** Young people and parent/carer voices at the heart of future development.

The anticipated benefits of this programme are:

- Improved learning outcomes for pupils with SEND in curriculum PE.
- Improved opportunities for pupils with SEND to thrive through PE and Sport (e.g. resilience, leadership and belonging)
- Increased confidence of classroom teachers to teach high quality PE.
- Improved confidence of classroom teachers to provide school sport activities to pupils with SEND.
- Improved sharing of best practice between school and teacher networks around the PE teaching of pupils with SEND.
- An increase in the number of pupils with SEND taking part in at least 20 minutes of physical activity every day.
- Improved behaviour and attainment of pupils with SEND through the sense of belonging created in school settings and the opportunity for them to thrive.

Activities for a Lead Inclusion School

Each Lead Inclusion School must deliver a range of core activities in the 2025-26, 2026-27 and 2027-28 academic years, with the additional option of delivering an innovation project. The specific activities for Lead Inclusion Schools that this research project needs to focus on for the first year are briefly outlined in the table below. For full details of the activities within year one of Inclusion 2028, please see Appendix 2.

OPTIONAL: Innovation Projects	There is one Innovation Project that each Lead Inclusion School can apply for in 2025/26 (see appendix for full details). This innovation project will focus on Alternative Provision and Pupil Referral Unit settings seeking to improve life skills (such as resilience and self-belief) through physical education, enabling pupils to thrive.

Delivery milestones

Each Lead Inclusion school must adhere to a set of reporting deadlines and delivery deadlines across the contract of Inclusion 2028. Please see Appendix 2 for full details.

The activities for 2026/27 and 2027/28 will be released on completion of the year one objectives and subject to the Government's spending review.

About the Research

Research aim

To undertake an independent evaluation of the Inclusion 2028 grant to provide evidence of the outcomes achieved and to draw out recommendations for the future development of the network.

Research questions

The key research questions are outlined in the following table.

The YST aims to put young people at the heart of everything we do and are therefore keen to inform and improve our delivery with insight from young people. A particular area of focus for the YST in this research will be to capture the views of young people directly and measure the impact of Inclusion 2028 through a baseline and follow up methodology (where possible) for example, revisiting pupils at the end of year delivery, and consideration should be given to how the research can effectively include 'youth voice'.

It is important to be able to demonstrate impact for young people with SEND and how their experiences and opportunities in relation to PESSPA have changed because of the project. Additionally, we would like the research organisation to consider how they can share back with young people directly the research findings.

¹ The outcome evaluation should focus on assessing whether the short term outcomes were achieved, but the YST would welcome consideration for whether participants are on the right path to achieving the longer term outcomes.

Methodology

The YST would like researchers to propose a methodology that best meets our needs. However, we have outlined a number of key methodological considerations:

- A focus on both quantitative and qualitative research methods. Extra consideration
 will be given to research methods which will involve young people with additional
 support needs, and if these methods are an appropriate measure to capture this data.
- On a termly basis, the YST distributes an online survey to all Lead Inclusion Schools.
 The survey collects data on reach (including demographics of participants), outcomes
 and views of the project. This data will be made available to the successful research
 organisation.
- How views of the project and impact on schools and key stakeholders (outside of each individual Lead Inclusion School) are proposed to be captured.
- The YST has a monitoring and evaluation framework in place to assess progress and impact against our latest strategy. The monitoring and evaluation framework would be shared with the successful research organisation, but we would expect our core outputs and outcomes to be captured through the evaluation.
- Case studies covering a range of perspectives and activities. These should be available as stand-alone documents but also integrated into the main report structure.
- We welcome suggestions as to how the experiences of young people and their families/carers can be gathered and showcased in creative ways.
- The YST will make school contact details available to the successful researcher, and any additional data / information that would help the research project.

Research Deliverables

The following deliverables are required from this research project:

- 1. **Inception note:** Following the inception meeting, a full research methodology, with associated timescales and research tools.
- 2. **Monthly progress updates:** Regular updates on progress and any challenges/risks in the project.
- Interim report (March 2026, March 2027, March 2028): A written report / slide
 deck to focus on the activity to date plus any broader emerging findings from wider
 programme delivery.
- 4. Final annual reports (June 2026, June 2027, June 2028): The YST would like one final report that integrates all sources of evidence and provides us with an understanding of the outcomes achieved, and recommendations to inform future delivery (maximum of 20 pages). There will be one single report, but we would value individual sections that look in more detail at each of the component parts. The report should be accompanied by a two-page executive summary and where appropriate, we would welcome the integration of visual diagrams and infographics to help present the findings. The report for year one and two will present an overview of the findings from each year independently, whereas year three will present cumulative data across all three years.
- 5. **Data files:** Any survey data files should be made available, in an appropriate format.

Further guidance on the report content, style and structure will be given to the successful organisation at the inception meeting. Please note that the project will need to be reported on by financial year rather than academic year.

Key Contacts

The research project will be overseen by Lucy Slavin (Research and Insight Specialist) and Kelly Fellows (Development Manager – Inclusion).

Research Timescales

We are looking to commission a research organisation to work collaboratively with us across the potential 3 years of the grant funding agreement (until April 2028) and are therefore looking for a proposal to demonstrate how evidence will be collected across this full period. However, the YST reserves the right to end the research contract with the successful organisation at the end of financial year 2025/6 or financial year 2026/7, if either the Department for Education ends the grant funding, or YST deems that the research output does not meet the needs of this brief.

Research Budget

The total budget for the research project is **£90,000** (inclusive of expenses and VAT, if applicable). This is broken down into £30,000 per year, for three years²

The successful Bidder will be paid against the following terms³:

Year one:

- 10% on a signed contract (June 2025)
- 40% upon satisfactory completion of the interim report (March 2026)
- 50% upon satisfactory completion of the final report (June 2026)

Years two and three

- 50% upon satisfactory completion of the interim report (March 2027, March 2028)
- 50% upon satisfactory completion of the final annual report (June 2027, June 2028)

² Year 2 and year 3 are subject to continuation of the government funding, reviewed annually

³ Year 2 and year 3 are satisfactory to performance in years 1 and 2 respectively – performance to be assessed by YST against the requirements set out in this research brief

The Bidding Process

Process

Responses to each section will be allocated a score based on the methodology contained below.

Bidders will be ranked in respect of their evaluation score from highest to lowest. The rankings will inform which organisations progress to the next stage of the process.

Innovation Projects: My Personal Best for Alternative Provision	There is one Innovation Project that Lead Inclusion Schools can apply for in 2025/26. This is the My Personal Best for Alternative Provision programme. To date, 50 schools have been involved in this programme, with a further 10 coming on board for 25-26. Schools receive training in the YST programme 'My PB' which will see young people with SEND attending Alternative Provision settings, accessing high quality curriculum PE approached in a way that clearly communicates life skills, with each young person thriving and achieving their personal best in physical education, in school, in work, as a citizen and in their personal life. Teachers involved in this project will take an action-research style approach to reposition the purpose and relevance of PE and share effective practice to adopting this approach with colleagues. This project requires a specific focus on engaging young people with SEND in Alternative Provision.

Appendix 3: Conditions of Participation

Bidding Instructions

Bidders should read the bidding instructions carefully before completing their proposal. Failure to comply with these requirements for completion and submission of the proposal may result in the rejection of the proposal.

Participation in the bidding process automatically signals that the Bidder accepts these conditions of participation.

This Research Brief is not an offer or guarantee of award of business and it does not form a contract between YST and the Bidder.

Intellectual Property Rights

All material issued in connection with this Research Brief shall remain the property of YST and shall be used only for the purpose of this procurement exercise.

Costs

Bidders must obtain for themselves at their own responsibility and expense all information necessary for the preparation of Proposals.

Bidders are solely responsible for the costs and expenses incurred in connection with the preparation and submission of their Proposal and all other stages of the selection process.

Under no circumstances will YST be liable for any costs or expenses borne by Bidders, sub-contractors, suppliers, or advisers in this process.

Confidentiality

Bidders shall treat the contents of the Research Brief and any related information as confidential information and shall only use this confidential information for the purposes of submitting (or deciding whether to submit) a Proposal.

Bidders may only disclose, distribute, or pass on any of the confidential information to their advisers or sub-contractors provided that this is done for the sole purpose of enabling a Proposal to be submitted and that the receiver of the information undertakes in writing to keep the information confidential on the same terms as if they were the Bidder.

YST may disclose, distribute, or pass on any of the information contained in the Bidder's proposal to external partners, where they are contractually involved in the project that is the subject of the research.

Modification by YST

At any time prior to the deadline for the receipt of Proposal, YST may modify the Research Brief and/or terms and conditions of the process. Any such amendment will be issued by YST to all prospective Bidders. To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing their Proposals, YST may, at its discretion, extend the Deadline for receipt of Proposals.

Proposal Deadline

YST may at its own absolute discretion extend the closing date and the time for receipt of Proposals. Any extension granted will apply to all Bidders.

Any Proposal received at the designated point after the deadline outlined in the Research Brief may be rejected.

Confirmation of Proposal Submission

Unless otherwise stated, YST will send an email to the key contact to confirm receipt of the Proposal within 2 working days of receiving the Proposal.

Proposal Validity

Your Proposal should remain open for acceptance for a period of 90 days.

Modification by Bidder

Bidders may modify their Proposal prior to the deadline by giving notice to YST.

No Proposal may be modified subsequent to the deadline for receipt.

Withdrawal by Bidder

Bidders may withdraw their Proposal at any time prior to the deadline or any other time prior to accepting the offer of a Contract. The notice to withdraw the Proposal must be in writing and sent to YST.

Right to Cancel

YST reserves the right to cancel the tender process at any stage prior to the award of the contract, without incurring any liability to the affected Bidders.

Right to Clarify

YST reserves the right to require the Bidder to clarify its Proposal in writing and/or provide additional information.

Right to Reject/Disqualify

YST reserves the right to reject or disqualify a Proposal where:
