Our Goal: To galvanise a strong, broad, and united national movement of schools that are connected and work together to tackle inequalities that exist for children and young people in accessing inspiring and meaningful play, PE and school sport opportunities. Sitting within the Well School movement, schools will place just as much emphasis on health and wellbeing as they do on academic performance.

Schools will drive individual and whole school improvement through the specialist area of Inclusion that formally aligns to the Youth Sport Trust and positioned to support our mission.

Our three strategy objectives that the Lead Schools will support us achieve.

- 1. Build back healthier, happier, and more resilient young people and level the playing field for those most disadvantaged.
- 2. To balance the demands of the digital age through the physical connection of physical play and sport.
- 3. Transform societies perceptions and attitudes towards the importance of physical literacy, play and sport in the education and development of young people.

Our Ambitions:

Through this infrastructure of specialist lead schools, we aim to create a strategic approach to innovation, concept development and delivery. We have 4 clear ambitions:

- 1. Build 'increased': Access to opportunities and empowerment of SEND pupils.
- 2. Build 'further': The capacity, capability & effective practice of the workforce generating sector-led improvement.
- 3. Build 'with': partners to innovate, encourage cross-sector collaboration and strengthen our collective ambition.
- 4. Build 'in': Young people and parent/carer voices at the heart of future development.

- Opportunities to work nationally with leading experts in PE, school sport and physical activity to enhance the health, wellbeing and achievements of students.

Application Process and Criteria

The purpose of the following sections is to highlight key deliverables that the YST Lead Inclusion School will be required to fulfill and additional projects that can be applied for in 2025-26.

THE COMPULSORY EXPECTATIONS OF A YST LEAD INCLUSION SCHOOL

- 1. To commit to being the lead Inclusion School for (time period 1st April 2025 to 31st August 2026)
- 2. To submit all **monitoring and evaluation** reports on time and keep to all agreed and pre-set deadlines. Funding will only be released on receipt of adequate data reporting in July, December 2025, March and July 2026.
- 3. You (or a representative of your team) must attend **national networking event for Lead Schools on September 22nd 2025 (in-person) and June 26th 2026 (virtual).**
- 4. To access a **minimum of 1 Development Coach** support session in 2025-26
- As a YST Lead Inclusion School, you must be a brand ambassador for YST and our ethos. Your role is to be:
 A champion for inclusion, an advocate and an adviser on high quality inclusive practice for young people with additional support needs in Physical Education, School Sport and School Games, working to empower SGO's, schools and other organisations across a county area.
- 6. To deliver the core delivery offer as outlined below:

As a Lead Inclusion School for a designated **County/Borough wide area** there is an expectation that where possible advocacy, guidance and support are 'offered' to Schools and SGO's across a county through engagement with the Strategic County Alliance groups and other local partners. Where there is reluctance of any partners to engage, this should be shared with the YST Development Coach, to discuss where additional support is required.
